



CERTIFICATE OF INDIAN STATUS (CIS) GUARANTOR DECLARATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

- The Guarantor must complete and sign the bottom portion of the declaration.
- The Guarantor must also sign and date the back of your photo.
- The Guarantor must have certified on the back of a photo the image to be a true likeness of the applicant.
- The Guarantor must have known the applicant personally for at least two (2) years.
- The Guarantor Declaration is acceptable as one (1) piece of I.D

CRITERIA

<p>A Guarantor may be the Issuing Officer (or <i>IRA - as per page 2 of the current CIS Policy</i>) or a professional person as per the guarantors specified for the purpose of obtaining a passport:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chief or Councillor from the individual's band • Dentist, medical doctor or chiropractor • Judge, magistrate, police officer (municipal, provincial, RCMP) • Lawyer • Mayor • Minister of religion authorized under provincial law to perform marriages • Notary Public • Optometrist • Pharmacist • Postmaster • Principal of a primary or secondary school • Professional Accountant • Professional Engineer • Senior administrator in a community college • Senior administrator or teacher in a university • Social Worker • Veterinarian 	<p>Along with the Guarantor's Form, the certified photo and the completed CIS application form, the applicant must also bring one (1) piece of I.D. in order to obtain a CIS card.</p> <p>ACCEPTABLE I.D.:</p> <p>The following are acceptable pieces of I.D. and must be <u>valid</u> & must not show more than normal wear and tear:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Birth Certificate or <i>Baptism for Quebec only</i> • Provincial Health Card (Care Card) • Driver's Licence • Provincial I.D. • Employee I.D. with digitized photo (with client's full name) • Student I.D. with digitized photo (with client's full name) • Marriage or Divorce Certificate • Legal Change of Name Certificate • Firearms Licence <p>The following I.D. <u>is the only I.D.</u> that can be accepted <u>if expired by six months or less:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Certificate of Indian Status (Status Card) <p>SIN Cards or photocopied ID will NOT be accepted</p>
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EXPIRED STATUS CARDS:

ALL Status Cards must be presented upon a client's application to renew/replace their Status Card, even if expired by over six months. The entire card is to be returned to Indigenous Services Canada. Otherwise, a Lost/Stolen Declaration Form must be completed.



NOTICE TO ALL APPLICANTS AND GUARANTORS

“Anyone knowingly submitting a false or misleading written declaration in order to obtain or renew the Certificate of Indian Status (CIS) can have: a) his/her renewal or new certificate refused by the issuing agent and/or Registrar; or b) the card issued by the issuing agent and or Registrar revoked.”
